

- Below is an explanation of what bindings work with what boot sole standards – NNN vs. SNS
- Pilot vs. SNS Profil vs. NNN BC vs. 75mm/3-pin.
- Remember, it is all about the boot. Before concerning yourself with bindings, decide on a boot that fits.
- Any ski can be used with any boot sole standard. The ski should not play into the decision-
- making process with regard to boots.

- What Bindings Work With it -				
*** Bindings in italics are compatible but not part of our inventory ***				
Any IFP/NIS/NNN (non- BC) binding. Examples of brands that use this standard include Fischer, Rossignol, Alpina, Rottefella.	Any Salmon or Atomic binding that says Pilot on the box.	Any Salmon or Atomic binding that says PROFIL on the box. NOTE: Profil bindings will ACCEPT a Pilot boot. But it DOES NOT work the other way around.	Any NNN BC Binding. All BC bindings are screw-on. BUT, you could, if you NEEDED to, screw a BC binding to a flat ski.	Works only with 75mm, 3-pin bindings. Typically used for telemark or depper backcountry use. Any time the terrain is very unpredictable or making turns on a slope might be required.
