

Shaupeneak Ridge Trail Map

This 936.5-acre park contains nearly 10 miles of trails that traverse varied habitats.

Blue Trail (1.18 miles)

This trail winds around Louisa Pond, which includes a small carry-in boat launch for nonmotorized boats. The pond's north side is a sensitive wetland area.

Yellow Trail (0.3 mile)

This short trail has several educational stations designed to teach park users about forest ecology.

Orange Trail (1.48 miles)

This trail offers a delightful stroll or bike through a mixed-woods forest. The trail begins a short distance past a beaver dam at the southwest bank of Louisa Pond. Mountain bikers rate this ride as difficult.

Red Trail (1.22 miles)

This trail is distinguished by scenic overlooks offering views of the Hudson River.

White Trail (1.63 miles)

The most challenging trail in the park connects the Old Post Road parking lot with the ridge top.

Purple Trail (0.10 mile)

This short spur off the White Trail leads to a waterfall.

Green Trail (1.47 miles)

Constructed by volunteers for mountain biking and hiking, this loop trail passes and crosses impressive rock ledges.

Aqua Trail (1.3 miles)

A loop off the Green Trail that provides similar challenges and scenery.

Orange-Green Connector (0.15 mile)

This trail connects the upper Orange Trail to the lower Green Trail over a series of rocky shelves. *(Intended for hikers only.)*
